

Virginia Infrastructure Findings

Infrastructure development is seen among registered voters as a way to boost jobs and the economy

89% of voters believe that if government and private industry were to invest in infrastructure, it would have a positive impact.



When it comes to expected outcomes from increasing our investment in infrastructure, the top two are...



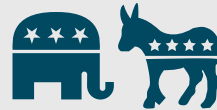
1. Creating good-paying jobs (63%)



2. Boosting our economy (58%)

Greater investment in energy infrastructure has broad bipartisan support

The following groups within Virginia support increasing investment in energy infrastructure:



92% of Republicans
81% of Democrats



81% of Clinton voters
94% of Trump voters



91% of union members
85% of non-union members



84% of environmentalists

- **Overall, 89% of voters believe if government and private industry were to invest in infrastructure, it would have a positive impact. This view point holds among key sub-groups:**
 - 91% of Republicans and 90% of Democrats believe it will have a positive impact.
 - 92% of self-identified environmentalists believe it will have a positive impact.
 - 94% of union members and 89% of non-union members believe it will have a positive impact.
- **Further, the consensus view of voters in Virginia (85%) is to support increasing our investment in our energy infrastructure, and 62% strongly support increasing our investment.**
 - No less than 80% of voters from any region in Virginia support increasing our investment in the energy infrastructure.
 - Better than eight-in-ten (81%) Clinton voters and 94% of Trump voters support increasing our investment in the energy infrastructure.
- **The overwhelming view of Virginia voters (81%) is to support increasing energy development in the U.S. This compares with just a scant handful (12%) who oppose increasing energy development.**
 - Support for increasing energy development is consistent throughout the state, never falling below 80% in any region in Virginia.
 - Support transcends political party as well in that 89% of Republicans and 72% of Democrats support an increase in energy development. Fully 75% of Clinton voters and 89% of Trump voters also support increasing energy development.
